### Film and the Co-operative Movement, by Steve Thompson

The Co-operative Movement of the 20th century consisted of Retail Societies which worked together with the support of the Cooperative Wholesale Society (CWS) and the Co-operative Union (now Co-operatives UK). The 21st century sees a very different kind of movement, but I think that there is value in seeing elements of continuity between the two.

The Co-operative Movement's involvement with cinema is as old as film itself and goes back to the 19th century. It started with lantern lectures in co-operative reading rooms and libraries, and went on to co-operative cinemas like the Blackpool Emporium, and screenings to large audiences at gatherings of the co-operative membership. Typical venues for CWS film screenings were co-operative shops and village halls, churches and chapels, and some taking place in the open air.

Film shows have always been a part of co-operative culture, education and entertainment.

The CWS Film Service and the Royal Arsenal Co-operative Society Film Unit both served the Movement during the 20th century. At that time, co-operative trading was a political statement because co-operative societies were demonstrating an alternative to capitalism and had a vision of building a co-operative commonwealth. I would recommend to anyone who is interested in this subject "The People's Cinema: film and the co-operative movement" by Alan Burton with a foreword by Richard Attenborough. Copies are available from the <u>Rochdale Pioneers Museum</u> for £6.50 or you can borrow the copy which we have in the <u>Principle 5 lending library</u>.

What do you think about Principle 5 organising film evenings? As a start, we have arranged to show some films from the CWS Film Archive at the Harlequin next door to Aizlewood's Mill
