CoTech Spring Gathering in Sheffield

CoTech (<u>https://coops.tech</u>) is a network of over 30 creative technology co-ops, formed in 2016. Their annual gathering for spring this year will be held in Sheffield on 25-26th April, at DINA (<u>http://dinavenue.com/</u>), an independent, not-for-profit venue in a building that originally held the city's first 'Free School', renovated by volunteers in 2016.

Members of CoTech work in a whole range of technical and creative fields. They include Fairmondo, the UK's first co-operatively owned online marketplace, and Media Co-op which offers communications, campaigning, promotion, education, training and broadcast. Other co-ops in the network offer services ranging from website hosting to software design, all fully owned and controlled by the people who do the work.


Discussions at the Spring Gathering will include climate and tech, how can CoTech make a difference? Collectively it has an impressive common pool of resources - how can this be used to effect change? Visitors from FACTTIC, Argentina's tech co-op network will also be discussing and sharing their methods of working together.

Two housing co-operatives in Sheffield, Fireside and Brambles, have helpfully offered accommodation to visitors to assist the gathering, which is being co-ordinated by Sheffield-based Webarchitects (<u>https://www.webarchitects.coop/</u>).


