Co-operatives have historically created culture and common wealth through collective self-help in working class communities. 


FIGURE 5.9. CWS campaign for capital, 1920. During a public meeting in South Wales, CWS electurer F. C. Crowther (pointing, at right) made the case for increased co-operative investment in the Wholesale. Later in the 1920s Crowther helped design CWS training programmes and was founder and producer of the Balloon Street Players, a theatre group for the CWS's Manchester appropriate.

Obituaries

The death has been announced of two leading campaigners for worker co-operatives in West Yorkshire. Sean Moran and Dave Brooks both died in their early 50s, and both were members of Radical Routes (a network of activist co-operatives across the UK, mostly housing co-ops). Cath Muller, activist and co-operator of Radical Routes, Cornerstone Housing Co-op and Footprint Workers Co-op remembers them.

Dave Brooks – died 14/6/2019. Among many other activities, Dave Brooks was absolutely committed to developing Hebden Bridge's co-operative identity. He was a founding member of Zion Housing Co-op, now Nutclough Housing Co-op, acquiring the Nutclough Tavern, Hebden Bridge in 2001. With his partner Em, he set up Weirdigans Cafe, then Mama Weirdigans (Hebden Hostel). They got involved in producing the Green Gathering and its Co-op Camp, creating space to promote radical co-ops. Dave's workers co-op, LED Fantastic provided the gathering with twinkly night-time illumination.





Sean Moran – died 21/3/2019. Sean was larger than life, endlessly curious and caring about people, managing to set people at their ease. His affinity with those excluded from society let him into drug and alcohol support work. His enthusiasm for Radical Routes and for making the setting up of co-ops accessible to all was infectious. He and his partner Cath usually turned up to help the day before gatherings, and welcomed early-comers warmly with an ever-brewing pot of tea. At Extinction Rebellion's Spring Uprising in April, he took a microphone for the first time, to tell people about radical co-operatives as solutions for housing, inequality and social transformation.
