Notice from the organisers of Sheffield's Festival of Debate

We have spent the last six months planning and programming the Festival of Debate 2020, working with over 70 partners to confirm 130 events to take place from 14 April to 31 May in Sheffield, Rotherham, Barnsley and Doncaster. To our knowledge, it would have been the biggest festival of non-partisan politics and civic engagement in the UK.

It is with great regret that we have concluded that none of these events can go ahead safely due to the coronavirus outbreak and we need to postpone the 2020 Festival of Debate programme. This is not a cancellation – at this time more than ever we need to discuss how we can come together to make change.

Co-operative news was indexed for around 50 years from it's first edition in 1871. It had not been indexed since the First World War. The current indexing is proceeding steadily.

Progress So Far

The editions held in the Principle 5 Resource Centre between 18th March 1997 and 17th July 2004 have been indexed. The uploading of this data to the on-line resource is ongoing.

Sheffield and Socialism Principle 5 Pamphlet No: 1

Sheffield and Socialism was first published in 1916 as part of Edward Carpenter's autobiography My Days and Dreams.

Carpenter was active within the Sheffield Socialist Society, a propagandist and campaigning group. In this memoir, he writes about the group's activities, such as opening a socialist café, and of the now forgotten individuals who tried to win people to socialism on the streets of Sheffield at the end of the 19th Century.
