
# Principle FIVE

### Heritage Open Days 11<sup>th</sup>-20<sup>th</sup> September 2020 Various events

Among the events in this annual heritage festival are some which will be of interest to co-operators:

- Portland Works, Little Sheffield. Online events celebrating this Grade 2\* listed building bought in 2013 through a community-owned project after years of campaigning. View the progress of restoration and repair completed over the last 7 years. It's a rare example of a Victorian cutlery factory, and is the place where stainless steel knives were made commercially for the very first time.
- Aizlewood's Mill, Nursery Street, Sheffield. Online events give a glimpse
  of this co-operative owned former mill, now a thriving and well-run
  business centre. Principle 5, housed there, also offers a co-operative
  presentation online.
- Birley Spa Bath House History Talk and Tour, Hackenthorpe, Sheffield.
   This is a hidden gem of local history, and Principle 5 has recently declared its support for Birley Spa Bath House redevelopment, proposed as a community-run and possibly co-operative project.
- Music, Art and Activism: Cultural Creativity and the Miners' Strike, at Orgreave, Sheffield. A night of music and art to commemorate the Miners' Strike of 1984/85, standing together now as strong as ever.
