Co-operatives UK was founded in 1870 as the Co-operative Central Board, changing its name to the Co-operative Union before finally becoming Co-operatives UK following its merger with the <u>Industrial Common Ownership Movement</u> (ICOM) in 2001.

The **Co-operative Congress** is the national conference of the UK Co-operative Movement. The first of the modern congresses took place in 1869 following a series of meetings called the "Owenite Congress" in the 1830s.

The first of the modern Congresses was held in London. It was the only one of the modern series not to be organised by Co-operatives UK: this was because one of the orders of business for the first Congress was the creation of the organisation, then called the Co-operative Central Board. Co-operatives UK was founded out of concerns that the success of the Co-operative Movement might lead to a loss of identity and its original vision, and was intended to be a national organisation to bind the Movement together and emphasise the role of co-operatives in wider society.

Co-operative News has been published continuously since 1871, one year after the founding of **Co-operatives UK.** Every Co-operative Congress has been reported in Co-operative News since 1871.
