Honora Enfield writing in 1927 explained that Cooperation is a system in which profits are eliminated and distribution and production are for use, and not for the private wealth accumulation of individuals i.e. profit. She was speaking about Consumer Co-operation.

The the debate about consumer co-operatives versus worker (producer) co-operatives raged in the late Victorian period as the CWS was coming into its ascendancy. J.T. W. Mitchell, was Chairman of the Co-operative Wholesale Society from 1878 – 1895 and argued for consumer co-operation. An excellent book by Stephen Yeo is:
