The plan is for Share Instead to offer three flats to rent in this new cohousing project in north-west Sheffield.

We welcome offers to purchase anywhere between £2,000 and £50,000 of loanstock. Interest rates are negotiable, up to 4%, and investment periods run from 5 years to 20 years. The offer period is from June to November 2023.

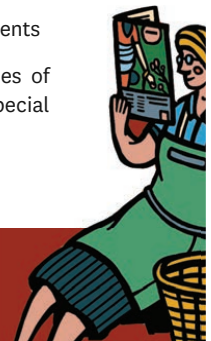
