#### **History from Common Experience**

National history has an important place in the common knowledge which the whole of society shares. But what's more important is the day to day history which we, our neighbours and our friends, relations and workmates have recorded from their experiences. This is genuine history which has not been modified for 'political' purposes by those who seek personal gain. This is history which promotes community solidarity.

A group of Sheffield people founded The Holberry Society in 1978 with an annual lecture, annual gatherings at the Grave of Samuel Holberry in the General Cemetery, a quarterly journal and a series of publication, exhibitions, community events, curriculum explorations and teacher groups in Sheffield and Rotherham. The Women's History group formed part of this. Cathy Burke (who devised the Radical Walk with John Baxter) and Bev Jackson both played a valuable part at that time with Paul Turner. John Baxter organised the South Yorkshire History Workshop events in 1978.

The society, including Sam Holmes, Bill Moore, John Baxter Tom Owen, Sue Owen, Nigel Clark, and Steve Bond spread its wings. Leading figures in the Sheffield Labour Movement such as George Caborn of the Engineering workers, Reg Munn of the Co-op Party, Vernon Thornes of the Trades Council, South Yorkshire County Councillors like John Cornwell and Bill Michie, and Enid Hattersley at Sheffield Council were highly supportive. David Blunkett showed genuine respect to all those working to these ends.

Principle 5 was pleased to be able to re-publish some of the writing from the Holberry Society archive under title 'Co-operators, Radicals, Workers: essays from the Holberry Society for the study of Sheffield Labour History. Vol 1' This is a 40 page pamphlet and is still available. 
## Principle 6 Co-operation Among Co-operatives

#### RULES

#### OF THE REFERENCE LIBRARY.

- 1.—The Library is open to all Student Members, and to Employees of the Society, free of charge. Members' Tickets are accepted as proof of identity.
- 2.—Books are issued every Tuesday, from 6-15 p.m. to 7 p.m., and are returnable on a Tuesday. The time allowed for the use of this book is 14 days, i.e., it should be returned on the second Tuesday following the day of issue. The date of issue is entered on the "Date borrowed" page.
- 3.—A book may be renewed, if no request has been made for it by another borrower, but to secure renewal it must be produced to the Librarian, in order that same may be properly entered.
- 4.—Borrowers detaining a book beyond the specified time will be charged 2d. per week or portion thereof.
- 5.—A borrower who loses a book or damages same will be required to pay such sum towards its replacement as may be fixed by the Educational Committee.
  - 6.—Use a bookmark and treat this volume carefully.
- 7.—The Librarian has the consent of the Educational Committee to use his discretion with reference to the issue of further books when the member has unduly delayed the return of any book.


## J.C.S. Members' Library


